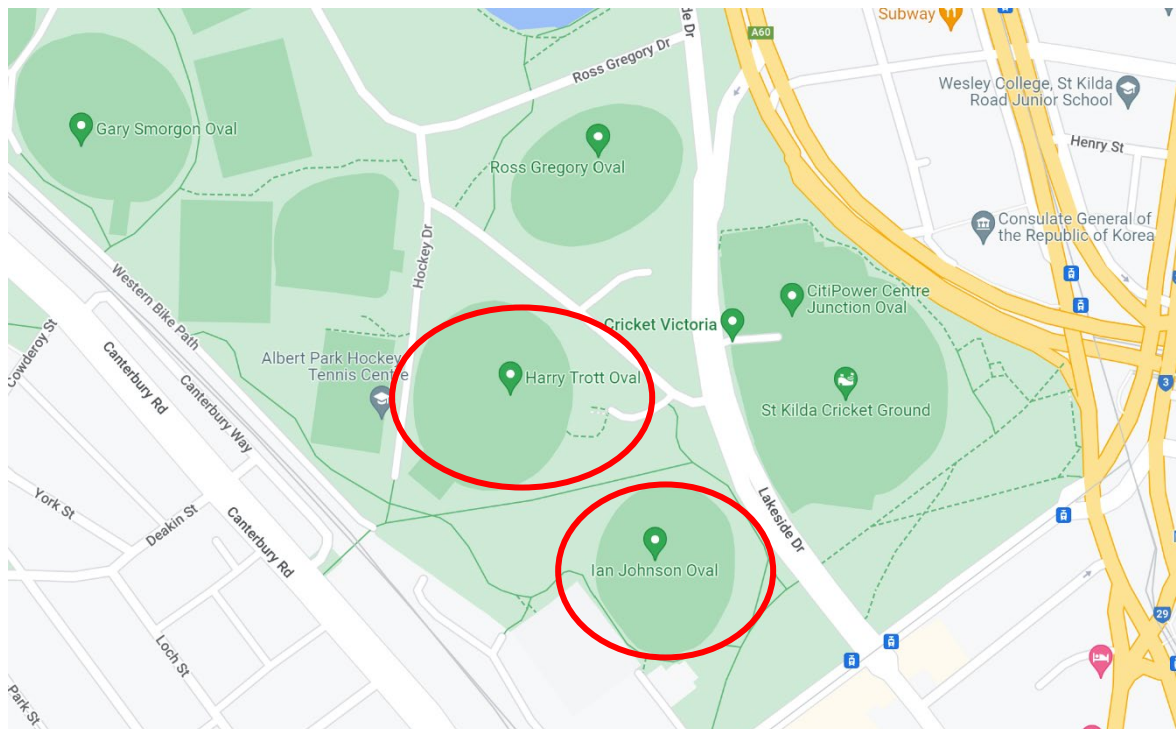

Competition Structure:

- Two pools of 4 schools each
- Each school plays 3 round robin matches
- The **top team in each pool advances to the Grand Final**
- Placing games will happen for all other teams

Round Robin Structure

- 4 points will be awarded to the winner of the round robin matches
- 2 points will be awarded for a draw in the round robin matches
- 0 points will be awarded for a loss in the round robin matches
- If at the end of the round robin matches, two teams are tied on the same number of points, the winner of their head-to-head match will advance
- If at the end of the round robin matches, two teams are tied on the same number of points and their head-to-head match was a draw, the team which has scored more total runs in their round robin matches will advance

Finals Structure

- The **top team in each pool advances to the Grand Final**
- Placing games will happen for all other teams

Match Conditions and Rules

- All matches will consist of sixteen (16) overs; each team will bat for eight (8) overs, and field for eight (8) overs.
- Matches will be subject to time; however, teams should be proactive to ensure matches are completed within the allotted timeframe for the round.
- At the start of the game, a 'bat flip' (or coin toss) will decide which team bats and fields- the first named team will flip the bat, while the second named team will call.
- Players will bat in 'pairs', and face two (2) overs between them (4 pairs per team= 8 players).
- Players will 'bowl' in pairs for two (2) overs at a time; one partner will bowl one over, while the other fields as wicket keeper, and then swap over the next over.
- Cricket Blast is conducted under the CV Cricket Blast Primary Rules.
- Please note there are specific modified rules around batting, bowling, 'no balls', 'free hits', 'fielding' and 'scoring'- officials and teams should have a firm understanding of these rules prior to competition.

It is the responsibility of the teams involved to be familiar with the rules as stated within this event info pack, and in the SSV Cricket Blast Primary Rules.

Girls Playing in Boys/Mixed

- A girl cannot play in a girls' team and a boys/mixed team in the same sport within the same calendar year. The stream of competition competed in at District level should be carried through to Division, Region and State.
- Team sheets are reviewed by the event convenor.
- Teams to be found in breach of this rule may face consequences, including disqualification.

Team Size

A team consists of max. twelve (12) players. Eight (8) players can take the field at any one time.

- Teams can substitute fielders at the conclusion of the current batting pair. Should a player be injured, they can be replaced immediately.
- A completed team sheet (endorsed by the school's principal or their representative) must be handed to the convenor prior to the commencement of play. If not provided, the teacher/coach will need to complete a team sheet manually prior to their team being able to play.

Equipment and Officials

All schools/teams participating in the State Boys/Mixed & Girls Cricket Blast Finals will need to provide:

- Wooden or plastic bats for use
- Warm up balls (if schools choose to)- all match balls will be supplied
- Wicket keeper helmet/grill (this is strongly encouraged, but not compulsory)
- 1x scorer: each team will be required to only supply a scorer- this will be communicated to qualifying teams either prior to, or on the day.
- 1x first aid kit (and any asthma/EpiPen's as required)

Uniforms and Dress

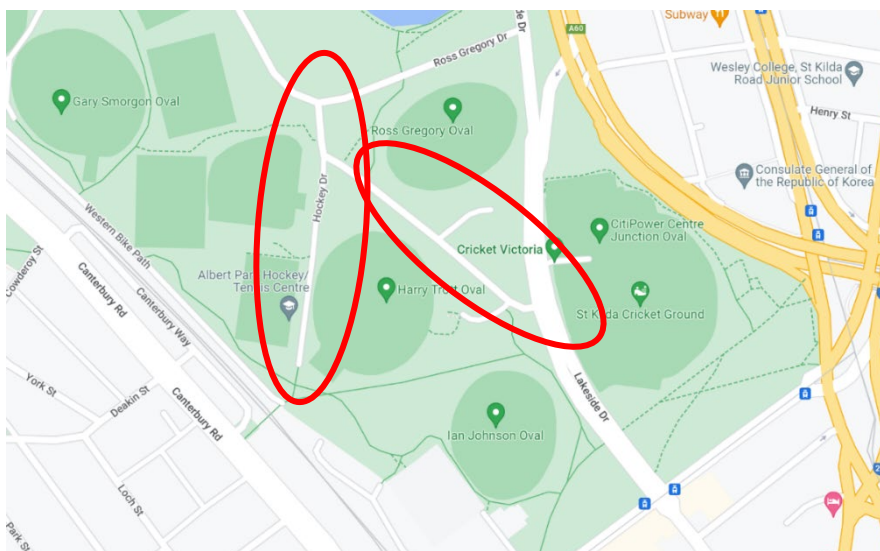
- Teams are encouraged to wear a uniform, or school sport uniform, to be easily identified by umpires during games.

First Aid

- There will be no first aid service supplied for this event. Schools will be responsible for attending to and administering their own first aid requirements.
- Schools must bring their own first aid kits, and ice packs to the event. If required, schools must bring their own student's EpiPen's and asthma kits to the event. Schools are responsible for their own student's anaphylaxis and asthma equipment and cannot rely on event first aid resources for these instances.
- Any strapping or taping requirements will be the players responsibility to have complete prior to game time. There will be no provisions for strapping and/or taping from event management.

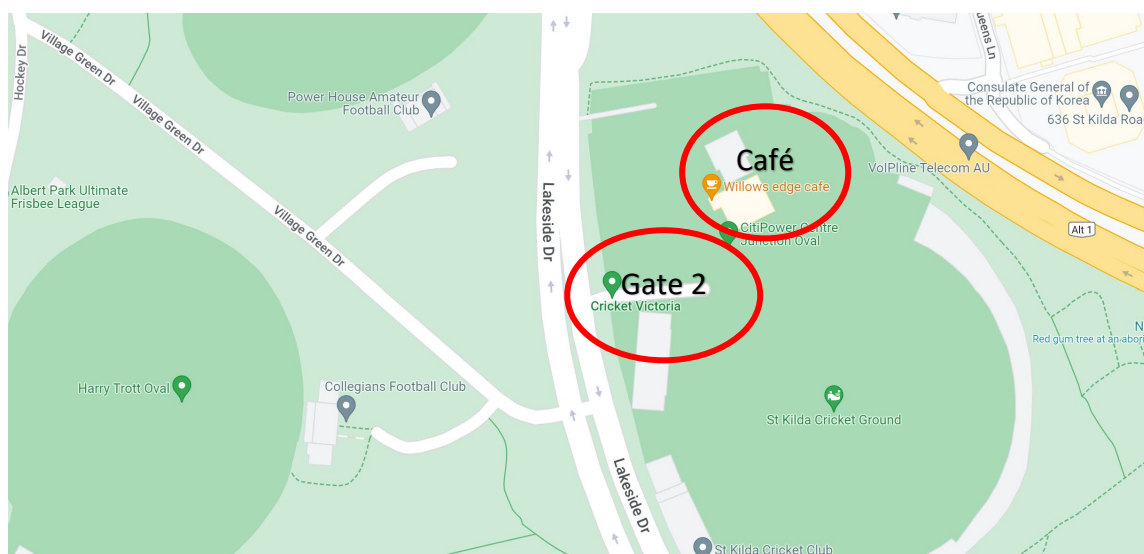
Parking
